The Rose City Astronomers (RCA) is a non-profit club organized to promote the education and enjoyment of amateur astronomy.

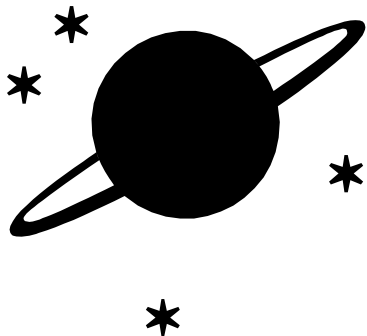
General meetings are held at the **Oregon Museum of Science and Industry (OMSI)** on the third Monday of every month.

Meetings include a special program often featuring a renowned speaker presenting the most current developments in astronomy, space research or amateur observing. Programs are designed to meet the needs of both novice and advanced amateur astronomers.

Newcomers are encouraged to attend a general meeting and join an enthusiastic group seeking to expand their knowledge of astronomy and enjoy camaraderie.

Members begin arriving at 7:00 PM for a social and informal mixing time, with the formal club meeting beginning at 7:30. Generally, meetings are held in the OMSI Auditorium, with periodic meetings in the OMSI Kendall Planetarium.

Star Parties



One primary activity of the RCA is **observing** at star parties. We hold star parties around new moon weekends at sites locally (within an hour of Portland), as well as at dark-sky sites in Central Oregon and Washington. All are welcome to attend, even without observing aids. Many members own portable telescopes and binoculars and are eager to share their views of deep sky objects, the Moon, and planets. Ask for information on attending star parties at the Membership Table at general meetings. Star parties are scheduled March through October, many with a host attending to provide assistance. Impromptu parties are often organized throughout the year when sky conditions are favorable.

Membership



A membership in RCA costs \$24 per year and covers the immediate family. The membership year runs from July 1 through June 30 of the following year, and dues are prorated according to the month you sign up. A membership registration form is located on the back side of this brochure.

With your new membership, you can pick up a *New Member Packet* at general meetings (not by mail). This packet for new members provides excellent orientation information to the club.

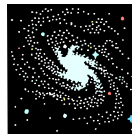
Special Interest Groups

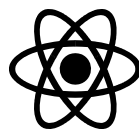
